"Once upon a time..." - legends in the making

Viktor Lilov - the alchemist of modern science

Once upon a time, there was a boy who loved mathematics. While other children ran outside to play, Viktor spent hours preparing for his entrance exams to the Sofia Mathematics High School. His curiosity was like an endless experiment. In sixth grade, he took part in his first serious science Olympiad and discovered that natural sciences were not just school subjects but an infinite universe he could explore for a lifetime. He realized that chemistry and biology fascinated him, and he wanted to delve deeper into them.

But Viktor was not just an inquisitive student. He was extraordinary. He became a true legend in science. In a single year, he won a gold medal at the prestigious Mendeleev Chemistry Olympiad in China, then became the only European to win gold at the International Biology Olympiad in Kazakhstan. And just 16 days later, at the International Chemistry Olympiad in Saudi Arabia, he achieved the second-highest ranking in the world and secured his third gold medal of the year. With his sharp mind, unwavering focus, and relentless dedication, Viktor carved his name into history.






In 2024, Viktor achieved something no student in the world had ever done before—he won gold medals in both the International Chemistry Olympiad and the International Biology Olympiad in the same year. Winning in just one science is an extraordinary feat. In two? Almost impossible. To claim two gold medals within a single year was a record unlikely to be broken anytime soon.

The recognition soon followed. He was awarded the Honorary Badge of the President of Bulgaria, and the world began talking about the young Bulgarian who had conquered international scientific peaks. But Viktor knew this was only the beginning.

At just 17, he embarked on his studies at Trinity College, Cambridge—the university that gave the world Newton and Darwin, as well as 34 Nobel laureates. Inspired by the greatest minds in history, Viktor is already following in their footsteps, working alongside one of the top researchers in organic chemistry, Professor Steven V. Ley.

And when asked what advice he would give to a child dreaming of changing the world through science, Viktor simply says: "Never give up and keep striving!"



Moments of Light: Glimmers, Hygge, and Ailyak

As February gently unfolds, we take a moment to reflect on those small but meaningful sparks that fill our days with light – they call them glimmers – those delicate little moments that remind us the world can be beautiful, cozy, and full of meaning.

The Scandinavians have long embraced this philosophy – they call it hygge. It's the warmth of a candle on a winter night, the sound of soft laughter around the table, the feeling of a blanket wrapping you in its softness.

In Bulgaria, we have our own version – ailyak.
