"Once upon a time..." - legends in the making

Penka Kouneva - the composer who turned dreams into music




Once upon a time in the modern world, there was a girl born with music in her heart. Her name was Penka Kouneva, and from a very young age, she knew she wanted to create worlds through sound. Her mother, a music analysis professor, recognized her talent and began teaching her how to write music. By the age of six, Penka was already composing small pieces, and as a student at the National Music School, she was creating music for children's theater productions.

But her dreams didn't stop there. She graduated from the National Academy of Music "Prof. Pancho Vladigerov" and later earned a full scholarship to the prestigious Duke University in North Carolina. There, she became the first PhD student in composition, proving that Bulgarian talent knows no boundaries. After completing her studies, she set out to conquer Hollywood—with just a backpack, no money, but an unshakable will and passion for music.

The journey was tough, but Penka never gave up. She started by arranging music for other composers, and over time, her own compositions found their place in some of the biggest film and gaming projects. Her talent resonated in blockbuster productions such as The Matrix, Pirates of the Caribbean, Transformers, and Prince of Persia. Her passion for new technologies also led her into the world of virtual reality, where her music brought to life The Mummy and Hellboy.

But Penka wanted to tell her own stories through music. She created original albums dedicated to the power of the human spirit. One of them, Woman Astronaut, was inspired by the brave women who dared to travel to space. Her music was so impactful that the album won the prestigious Hollywood Music in Media Award.

Her greatest recognition came in 2022 when her album Women Warriors: The Voices of Change won a Grammy Award. The work was dedicated to female activists from around the world fighting for equality and justice. Penka composed the music for the album's most dramatic moments, including the protests against the AIDS crisis, the Me Too movement, and the struggle for peace in the Middle East.



Today, Penka Kouneva's music can even be heard at the Kennedy Space Center in Florida, where it tells the story of space missions. She is living proof that dreams have no limits and that talent, hard work, and perseverance can turn a little girl with a piano into a true legend on the global music stage.
